Soles for Souls

This project for peace, started by Sgt. Gilbert Zepeda, a Californian reconnaissance soldier in Iraq, is intended to provide shoes for children in Iraq. He had noticed that many children were lacking shoes, a great discomfort in such a hot environment where they live. It is his contention that by meeting a significant need of the young people in Iraq, the future generation of Iraqi citizens will be more inclined to be friends of America. So Gilbert's goal, once his unit enters a town in Iraq, is to make sure every child in that town has a pair of shoes before he leaves that town.

St. Priscilla parish contributed 314 pairs of shoes along with \$213 to meet shipping costs. The youth group is busily packaging and shipping the shoes. So far they have shipped 27 flat rate boxes at a cost of \$207.90. They have 29 flat rate boxes remaining to ship and so they need another \$218.20. If you can spare a dollar or two to help make up the shortfall, please pass it along to Matt Zinn, Shea Nyeste, Steve Tabor, Ken Vader, Christine Depowski, Deacon Bob or the parish office.

Obviously, with many of our parishioners, including Fr. Ray Bucon, away on military duty, our parish is intimately aware of the need for peace in our world today and has responded generously in a positive way toward that end.

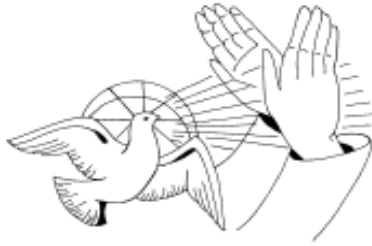

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Our program is in full swing now. Preschool /Kindergarten classes started last Sunday. We have 243 students attending classes at St. Priscilla. Classes are meeting each week until our Thanksgiving break in November.

Sacramental Preparation has begun with a parent/child workshop for First Eucharist a mini-retreat for Confirmation, and parent meetings for First Reconciliation. This February we will have 41 students being confirmed, in May, 20 children will be celebrating their First Communion and about 32 children will celebrate Reconciliation for the first time during Lent. Another 8 children are part of our Christian Initiation for Children program, an RCIA type program for children older than grade 2 who have missed sacraments for some reason.

Fr. Ray Update

There has been more violence here than in days past. I think it's because winter is coming. It's also because we're winning the global war on terror here. I attended a ribbon cutting ceremony in the village square of Sharona. This was my first time in the middle of a crowd of Afghani people where anything could happen and I was a bit apprehensive. I had my chaplain assistant especially watch for motorcycles that might be carrying unwanted surprises. The event was the opening of a cobble stone road, the first paved "anything" in the village. The road is about three blocks long, uses local building materials, and is a promise made and fulfilled by the local Paktika Provincial Governor and village elders all working together for the public good. The local elders and the governor were present and about 350 Afghani men and boys. There wasn't a woman to be seen. I started high-fiving the kids and brought smiles to their faces. The local police had security forces on the tops of the two story mud covered buildings and an Afghanistan National Army soldier was even walking around with a brightly colored RPG at his side. Corruption has been a way of life here for so long so any improvement costs extra and takes extra time.

Many roads are going in; roads meaning dirt with gravel over the top that are built well enough that the spring melt won't wash them out. On the one road between the villages of Sharona and Waza Khwa there are 182 culverts and water retaining walls that have to go in before the road can be finished. The cost is 1 million dollars for the work being done and is so much better than doing nothing or letting the people figure out things on their own. They have been under foreign rule and domination for many generations and it will take time to win their hearts and minds and change their attitudes.

The water was turned off the other day because of a collapsed water pipe. No hot shower at forward Operating Base Sharona. We bumped 9 hours down the road to Waza Khwa and got in after dark. There was so much dust in the vehicle I teased the driver about having a special machine in the front to blow dust into the back seat where I bounced around. Sometimes we drove through wadi's dry river beds. Sometimes we drove over hard-packed earth next to the road as we were concerned with IED's (improvised exploding devices) and mines that seemed to be prevalent in the area where we traveling. There were always holes to dodge and little valleys to traverse. Once we got up to 35 miles per hour but usually could only drive between five and ten miles per hour. The soldiers did a super job and delivered the convoy safely to our destination.

There's hot water in FOB Waza Khwa, and cold weather during the night. The day heats up nicely with a brightly shining sun. I said Mass Saturday night in the mess hall after dinner and another Mass in the mess hall between breakfast and lunch on Sunday. I helped sweep and mop up so the room could be ready on time. On Monday the plan is to move on to Bagram Air Base via a Chinook helicopter for a chaplain meeting and then on to FOB Ghazni, FOB Falcon South and then "home" to FOB Orgun-E. I like traveling around but from now on I'm only flying to Waza Khawa. It's so far away. But I said that the last time I drove here and when the opportunity presented itself, I took it and joined last Tuesday's convoy.

More news to come.
