FR. JIM'S JOURNAL

It is now time again for the Catholic Services Appeal (CSA). Many of the programs and offices of the Archdiocese of Detroit are funded by CSA dollars. All of the money that is donated to CSA supports projects and services within the Archdiocese.



Most of the funding for Sacred Heart Major Seminary comes from CSA. This is the seminary that educates and forms all of the Diocesan Priests for the Archdiocese of Detroit. The seminary process for the priesthood takes about 8 years if the individual comes into seminary without a Bachelor's degree. It takes about 6 years if the individual already has a Bachelor's degree. CSA pays room and board and tuition for the last four years of the seminary process. Your donations help to support our future priests.

The seminary also provides education and formation for our permanent deacon candidates. Our own Ron Vader is currently in this program. There are over 500 commuter students that are taking classes, many of whom are working on various degrees in theology and pastoral studies. The seminary plays a major role in educating and forming our permanent deacons and parish lay leadership.

The Archdiocese is also expanding programs for youth and young adult ministry. Our youth and young adults are the present and future of our Church. Ministry to these groups is extremely important. These are just a few of the programs that your CSA dollars support.

A goal is set each year for each individual parish. If the parish does not meet the goal, the money must be taken out of the offertory collections. If the parish exceeds the goal in terms of contributions, the money collected in excess of the goal is returned to the parish without the normal 6% tax. This past year, we received about \$10,000 back from CSA. This money, and any money returned this year will be used to improve our facilities. You should have received a letter and pledge card in the mail this past week. Please give generously.

Speaking of income to the parish, the only major fundraiser that the parish has is Bingo. We receive a very significant amount of income from Bingo every year. We are currently in need of some Bingo work-

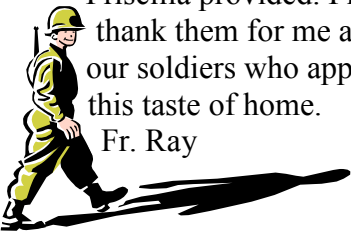




RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



Letter from Iraq, April 30, 2006

Dear Family and Friends,

The beginning of April saw me return to Iraq from my two week R & R in Michigan. It took three days to get back to Forward Operating Base Speicher, passing through Atlanta, Germany, Kuwait and then Iraq.

I was greeted by the 101st Airborne Division Command Chaplain with the choice of remaining stationed at FOB Speicher and resuming my duties, or traveling to the more northern base just outside the city of Tall Afar. One of the three priests covering the northern section of the 101st Airborne Division's area of operations had returned to the U.S. after his tour of duty was completed. I could fit into his slot.

Always ready to see new places and meet new people, I agreed to go and on Holy Thursday evening I flew to and celebrated my first Last Supper Mass at an even more Forward Operations Base. I had Good Friday Liturgy with soldiers there and then returned back to FOB Sykes to pray the Stations of the Cross with soldiers at my new 'home base'. The Easter Vigil and Easter morning Mass was celebrated at FOB Sykes and then I was helicoptered to FOB Al Kisik and FOB Sinjar for additional Easter Day Masses.

The week after Easter took me to groups of soldiers at places known to U.S. personnel as the Granary, Alcatraz, the Castle, the Mansion, and Burma. Due to other mission requirements some of my travel to places known as Rabiyaq, Ft. Tall Afar, Biaj, and Sinjar Retrans was delayed for two weeks. I hope to get to some of these farther away FOBs in the immediate days ahead.

It's hard to believe that the month of May is almost here. I often think about the temperature back in Michigan, knowing many of my family and friends are enjoying warmish spring weather. I am fortunate in that being located farther North there is still 50 degree nights and only 80 degree days. This will change in June and July but I will be back in the U.S. in August, avoiding the highest heat of Iraqi days and receiving a much needed rest. Then I will see where the military needs me. Adding my time overseas at Guantanamo Bay in 2003 to present time served in Afghanistan and Iraq I am hoping for a quieter assignment. In July of 2007, I will return to the Archdiocese of Detroit and decide on whether to continue serving in the Army Reserve or retire with 21 years of service. I will definitely remain a priest serving in the Archdiocese of Detroit.

My physically easy days of the war when I stay in place for awhile are punctuated with news of the hardships and even deaths of other soldiers in the 101st Airborne Division to which I am assigned. News from other theaters of the Global War on Terrorism also brings sadness and questions of how are we going to get out of what we've gotten ourselves into?

You know that the military has affirmed my penchant to keep track of things; reports have to be made. I calculate that in 240 days of duty in Afghanistan and Iraq I have changed bases 140 times. Travel by convoy (60%) is a bit higher than helicopter travel (40%).

With the short time remaining I have really begun to worry about making it home alive. This is a naturally occurring thing that many soldiers endure. I don't want to take the chances I have taken in the first months of deployment. I pray God will reunite us in the days ahead. I'll bring the beverage.

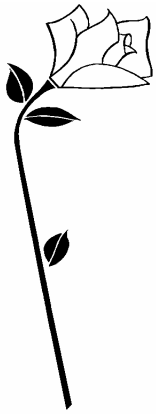
Chaplet of Divine Mercy

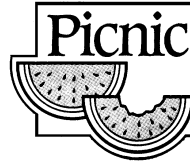
