As you can see, our improvements in the church are moving forward. We now have a larger Reconciliation Room, and we will soon be able to lock off the church when only the Activity Center is in use. Painting is well under way, and should be completed soon. I am working with the Worship Commission to decide where the artwork will be re-hung in the church. With the new paint, we want to make sure that everything gets hung where it is going to stay. For the most part, things will go back where they were, but we are going to make some minor changes.

The Stewardship Commission is in the process of making plans to purchase a new church sign to replace the damaged sign on Seven Mile. The old sign was a temporary sign, and when the construction on Seven Mile is completed, we will be ready to install a new permanent sign. The new sign will be lit at night, making our church easier to find after dark.

We are also going to have some changes in the area of Youth Ministry. Mary Ann Jenkins, our new Coordinator of Youth Ministry and Christian Service, invited our teens to come on Monday of last week and see what we are planning for Youth Ministry at St. Priscilla and to give their input. A total of 18 teens came. I was really glad to see such a good turn out. We will be doing some exciting things this year in Youth Ministry!

Mary Ann cannot do everything on her own. We really need adults, who would like to work with teens, to volunteer to work in this ministry. We need people to work directly with the teens and people to work behind the scene. You do not need to know how to do youth ministry, you just need to have the interest and be willing to learn. If you are willing to do the ministry, Mary Ann is willing to teach you how to do the ministry. If you think you may be interested, please attend the meeting on Tuesday, September 26th at 7:00 PM in the Youth Room. I look forward to meeting with you on Tuesday. Our youth are the present and future of the Church. It is really important that we do everything that we can to nurture them in our faith.

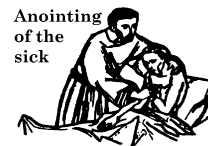

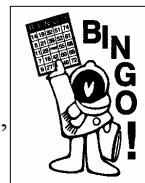

Thank you for your time after all of the masses last weekend to hear the message about youth ministry. It is essential that we begin with a broad and clear vision of youth ministry as we build the foundation of our program here at St. Priscilla's. There was a lot of information presented so I am including my notes in this article for you to review and reflect upon. And once again, **I invite any adult who is interested in finding out more information about the new youth ministry program and/or may be interested in working with me to come to a meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 26th in the Youth Room (Room 5) at 7p.m.**

Youth Ministry Message – presented weekend of September 16-17

Adolescence is one of the most difficult periods of life. The transition from childhood to adulthood is a complex time that brings about a crisis of identity for teenagers. They are asking themselves, “Who am I?” and “Where do I belong?” Their peer relationships can consume them. Issues about sexuality may preoccupy their thoughts. They are searching for answers and boundaries. They are looking for the meaning of life and want to make a difference.

At the same time they are in a cultural war. Many times they lack significant relationships with caring adults. They are learning mostly from their peers and pop culture. The media like music, television, movies and Internet influences them. They are targets of economic manipulation (Bob Pitman, the CEO of MTV in 1994 said, “At MTV we don't market to 14 year olds- we own them.”) Our teens see a culture that values individualism and materialism. They see religious values constantly under attack. They see an overall disregard for the sanctity of life.

They are desperately looking for leadership. They are looking for caring adults who will mentor them, encourage them and be a consistent source of affirmation in their lives.

God is calling us to be missionaries. Just as an effective missionary would enter a foreign culture, adults need to enter youth culture with profound respect and a sincere interest to know their world.

The reality is... we all play role of youth minister every time we come in contact with young people. We need to remember the significance of our interaction with them. If you are a coach, you are a youth minister. If you work with young people, you are a youth minister. If you have your kids friends over at your house, or encounter teens at the church you are a youth minister. If you are an aunt/uncle or grandparent you are a youth minister.

Youth ministers and caring adults need to be personally present to teens, connect them to the church and walk with them.

I hope that you understand that we are all in this together, that it takes a whole church to minister to our young people. And with this understanding I invite you to take on the role of youth minister in whatever capacity fits your life.

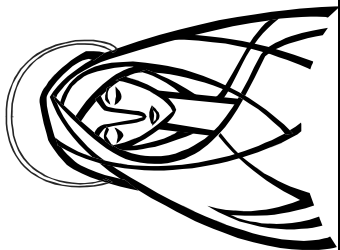

**Cholesterol Updates
submitted by Kay Kermodé**

The ATP III (Adult Treatment Panel III) released in 2001 is endorsed by the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute, the American Heart Association and the American College of Cardiology. In July 2004, the panel was updated to offer options for more intensive cholesterol-lowering treatment for people at high risk and moderately-high risk for a heart attack. The update emphasizes that therapeutic lifestyle changes-low saturated fat and low cholesterol diet, physical activity, and weight control-remain the cornerstone of treatment for lowering cholesterol levels. As a summary, the following guidelines are recognized as current:

TOTAL CHOLESTEROL	Less than 200mg./dL
LDL (Bad) Cholesterol	
Low risk:	Less than 160 mg/dL
Intermediate Risk:	Less than 130 mg/dL
High Risk:	(Including those who have heart disease or diabetes)
Very High Risk:	Less than 70 g/dL
HDL (Good) Cholesterol	Women: 50 mg/dL or higher Men: 40mg/dL or higher
Triglycerides	Less than 150 mg/dL

In addition, the modifications recommend consideration of drug treatment in addition to lifestyle therapy for LDL levels of 100 mg/dL or higher in high-risk patients, and characterizes drug treatment as optional for LDL less than 100 mg/dL. 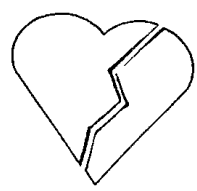
