Memorial Day was originally known as Decoration Day because it was a time set aside to honor the nation's Civil War dead by decorating their graves. It was first widely observed on May 30, 1868, to commemorate the sacrifices of Civil War soldiers.

By the late 1800s, many communities across the country had begun to celebrate Memorial Day. After World War I, observances also began to honor those who had died in all of America's wars. In 1971, Congress declared Memorial Day a national holiday to be celebrated the last Monday in May.

Today, Memorial Day is celebrated at Arlington National Cemetery with a ceremony in which a small American flag is placed on each grave. Also, it is customary for the president or vice-president to give a speech honoring the contributions of the dead and lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. About 5,000 people attend the ceremony annually.

I think it is important for all of us to pause and give thanks to the many men and women who have given their lives to protect the liberties we have today in this country. We would not have the many freedoms that we take for granted in this country without their great dedication and self sacrifice. Our ability to worship and give glory and praise to God openly and in the way we choose is a great privilege.

I think it is important that we all spend some time in prayer this holiday weekend for all of the service men and women who have given their lives for our country. We should also pray that God protect all of our active military personnel from all harm. We ask God to send his Spirit of Wisdom that we may achieve a true and lasting peace in the world.

I pray that all of the members of our parish family who are traveling this weekend may return to us safe and sound. If you are spending some special time with family or friends, love them and hold them close. Have a blessed holiday weekend.

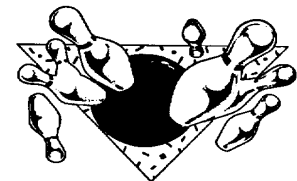
**Saintly Snapshot

St. Joan of Arc

Joan was born on January 6th, 1412, in the obscure village of Domremy in the French province of Lorraine.

At a young age, Joan began to hear the voices of Sts. Michael the Archangel, St. Catharine and St. Margaret. Eventually, she was told to seek out the Dauphin and have him crowned king of France.

Proving time and again the authentic nature of 'her' voices, Joan led the French armies to a series of stunning victories, only to be betrayed, captured, and finally unjustly burned as a witch by France's enemies. Today, Joan is the patroness of both the country of France and soldiers worldwide.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Next Sunday the Church celebrates the feast of **PENTECOST**. Pentecost is our annual celebration of the Holy Spirit, who is the life and unity of the Church, the source of its holiness, dedication, and wisdom. Pentecost is a *solemnity*, which means a feast that deserves special notice and preparation.

The days between Ascension Thursday and Pentecost Sunday should be a time for us to reflect on the presence of the Holy Spirit among us and a time of prayer for the gifts that the Holy Spirit brings. These days should help us prepare a place in our lives for a new coming of the Spirit. We can pray for the good of the Church and for the strength of our parish, as well as for a deepening devotion for the God who made us, who saves us, and who is with us at every moment.

Red is the color of Pentecost decorations. Red and red-orange remind us of the flames that signaled the coming of the Holy Spirit at the first Pentecost in Jerusalem. We also use doves, clouds and wind as Spirit symbols.

Spend some time this week reflecting on how the Holy Spirit is working in your own life. Which Gifts of the Spirit do you see at work in others? How do you demonstrate the Fruits of the Spirit?






DID YOU KNOW.....

There is a statue that stands outside the Iraqi palace, new home to the *4th Infantry Division*. It will eventually be shipped home and put in the Memorial Museum in Fort Hood, Texas.

The statue was created by an Iraqi artist named Kalat, who for years was forced by Saddam Hussein to make the many hundreds of bronze busts of Saddam that dotted Baghdad.

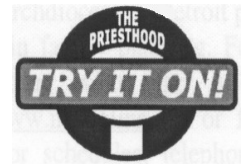
Kalat was so grateful for the American's liberation of his country he melted three of the heads of the fallen Saddam and made the statue as a memorial to the American soldiers and their fallen warriors. Kalat worked on this memorial night and day for several months.

To the left of the kneeling soldier is a small Iraqi girl giving the soldier comfort as he mourns the loss of his comrade in arms; depicted by an empty pair of army boots.

We don't always here the positive stories about the war. Let us pass this on in honor of all our brave military who are making a difference.

Why Sundays?

Why do Christians worship on Sundays, when the Hebrew Sabbath was on Saturday?

We know that Christ died as the Sabbath was approaching; Hebrew law forbade killing a man on the Sabbath, which was why the thieves were killed at Christ's left and right before the day of crucifixion was over. Thus, Christ's resurrection came on the day *after* the Jewish Sabbath, three days after His death.

Christians have thus ever since set-aside the day *after* the Hebrew Sabbath for worship, in commemoration of the Lord's conquest over death. Today, we call this day *Sunday* and recognize it as the *new* Sabbath for followers of Christ.

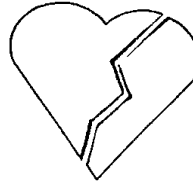
