FR. JIM'S JOURNAL

Ash Wednesday is this week, and it marks the official beginning of Lent. Lent is a pilgrimage through the desert, a place where no one lives, but where God can be encountered. God led Jesus, Moses and Elijah into the desert. It is in the desert that God acts. It is where he made his covenant with Israel. It is where good and evil struggle. It is where both conflict and victory occur. During Lent, we are invited into the desert. We withdraw from the concerns of the world. Prayer, fasting and alms giving are the vehicles for entering into the desert.



Lent is a season to get back to basics. We clear everything superfluous out of the church. The color of the season is purple. The Alleluia is not uttered.

This year for Lent as a Parish Family, we are going to place a special emphasis upon prayer. As with any relationship, in order to nurture our relationship with God, we need to spend time with him. We need to take some quiet time to spend with the Lord each day. As you plan what you are going to do this year during Lent, please schedule some special time each day for prayer.

In order to help you in your prayer life, we are going to give you the opportunity to learn about and experience different forms of personal prayer. Our next Growing in Faith Together (G.I.F.T.) session is on prayer. There are two primary types of prayer. First of these is communal prayer. One example of communal prayer is the Mass. We gather together in common prayer and worship each weekend. The second is personal prayer. This is time that we spend individually with the Lord. Personal prayer is the focus of the next G.I.F.T. session. It will include topics such as: creating a prayerful environment; meditation; journaling; intercessory prayer and bring prayer into our daily lives. Please plan to attend one of the G.I.F.T. sessions. They will take place on Friday, March 2nd from 6:00 – 9:00 and Sunday, March 4th from 12:30 – 3:30.

During these G.I.F.T sessions we will be preparing for opportunities for personal prayer here at the parish. It will give you the opportunity to experience several forms of personal prayer and share your

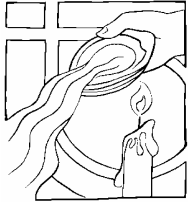

CALL TO CONTINUING CONVERSION**

Next Sunday at the 11:00 Mass we will celebrate the "Rite of Sending for Election" with our catechumens (Mark Yokom, Dianne Craig, Julie Flowers, Felicia Flowers, Megan Priebe and Melanie Prince). We will celebrate the "Rite of sending for the "Call to Continuing Conversion" with our baptized candidates (Jeff Sotzen and Sarah Monette). The Church has discerned their readiness for reception of the initiation sacraments this Easter. After these rites are celebrated here next Sunday, these catechumens and candidates, along with their godparents and sponsors, will be sent by our parish to the Cardinal for the "Rite of Election" and "Call to Continuing Conversion" at 2 PM at the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament. Based on the testimony given by the sponsors and our support of their readiness for the sacraments, Cardinal Maida will declare the catechumens to be elect, chosen by God for the sacraments this Easter. The Cardinal also will recognize the desire of the baptized candidates for the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist within the Catholic community.

Please keep these catechumens, candidates, their sponsors and families in you prayers as they begin their final preparation for receiving the initiation sacraments at the Easter Vigil. The 6 weeks of Lent mark for them the period of Purification and Enlightenment.

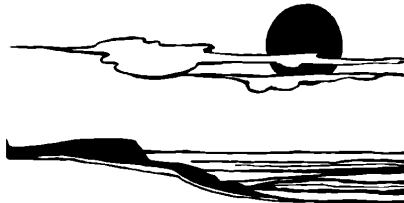

**Reflections on the Readings of
February 18th, 2007
by Deacon Bob Fitzgerald**

Today's scriptures tell us of the need for us to forgive. Jesus tells us that we must not harbor ill feelings for anyone. This is a very difficult challenge to live up to. Everything in our world encourages us to do just the opposite. One of the most intense temptations in our lives is to exact revenge on those who harm us. It seems that, once someone inflicts pain on us, we have the right and almost the obligation to retaliate. I think that most people would refer to this as justice.

Jesus calls his followers to a much greater code of conduct. His command is to "do unto others as you would like them to do unto you". He does not specify that this only applies when someone has been nice to me. Indeed, he calls for me to forgive my enemies and to turn my other cheek. This is valor above and beyond the call of duty. God, however, offers us gifts that are way above the scope of human possibility and , in turn, asks us to act in ways that are above normal human standards.


In the first reading, David has the opportunity to slay Saul who has set out to destroy him. He spares Saul's life because he feels that God is asking him to do so. He proclaims that God will reward us for true justice and faithfulness.

Jesus takes this principle a step farther. He pleads with us to forgive all, even if they are a threat to us or have harmed us in some way. Whenever we can rid ourselves of anger or thoughts of revenge, we have done ourselves a great favor. When we harbor these feelings, it makes it impossible to love the way that God expects us to. We must put our hurt feelings in the hands of Jesus and move on.

The second part of the gospel is very important. It tells us that we will be judged by the way we judge others. This means that, if we look for the faults in others, that is how we will be judged by God. If, however, we look for only the good in other people then, at our judgment, God will only look for the good that we accomplished in our lives. Our society dwells on the faults of others. We must rise above that way of judging our fellow humans. All people are capable of being loved or hated. We must look for ways of loving all people and then our judgment will be the best moment of our life.

Health & Wellness Awareness Kit

The holiday season should be a time for family celebrations. Unfortunately it is also a time when we see a tragic jump in the number of alcohol-and drug related highway fatalities each year. December is National Drunk and Drugged Driving Prevention Month— a good time to be mindful of this issue
Impaired Driving Defined

“Impaired driving” is driving under the influence of alcohol and/or illicit drugs. When you consume alcohol and or/illicit drugs, even at low levels, your ability to drive is impaired, although outward signs of impairment may not be evident.

State laws may also use the terms “driving under the influence” or “driving while intoxicated”. The term “alcohol” generally refers to beer, wine, whiskey, gin, rum, vodka, tequila, or other alcoholic beverages. The term ‘illicit drugs’ generally refers to marijuana, cocaine (including crack), inhalants, hallucinogens, heroin, or prescription-type drugs uses nonmedically.

Dangers of Impaired Driving

Safe driving demands your alertness and attention. You must be capable of making decisions in a split second and then making maneuvers based on those decisions. However, drinking alcohol and/or taking drugs impair a wide range of skills necessary for you to carry out these tasks. Take a look:

Substance	Effects:
Alcohol	Dulls your judgment and concentration Slows reaction time Blurs vision and impairs hearing Hinders muscle control and coordination Lowers alertness Shuts down ability to detect danger
Drugs	Alter motor skills Alters reaction time and judgment Alters other faculties needed for safe driving
Alcohol and drugs	Dulls your judgment and concentration Slows reaction time Blurs vision and impairs hearing Hinders muscle control and coordination Exaggerates emotions Increases drowsiness

These effects increase the risk of motor vehicle crash, reckless driving, and fatal accidents. Impaired driving not only puts a driver at risk, but passengers and others who share the road are also put at risk. Each

year, impaired drivers kill 17,000 people. More than 300,000 people are hurt and 1.5 million are arrested.

Myths about impairment and driving

Don't let myths and misconceptions about alcohol and drugs and their effects on driving fool you. Drinking coffee or taking a cold shower will not sober you up. No amount of fresh, chilly air can reverse impairment.

Preventing Impaired Driving

You should know that small amounts of alcohol and/or drugs (even some over-the-counter medications) can affect your brain and your ability to drive. People often swear they are "fine," but failure to recognize impairment is often a symptom of impairment itself. Therefore, if you drink alcohol or take drugs, don't drive.

Instead:

- ◆ Choose a non-impaired friend as a designated driver.
- ◆ Take a taxi (your community may have a Safe Rides Program)
- ◆ Ask ahead of time if you can stay over at your host's location.

You may never know how many lives you have saved when you don't drive while impaired. Trust that you are an instrument of safety. And always wear your seat belt - it's your best defense against impaired drivers.
