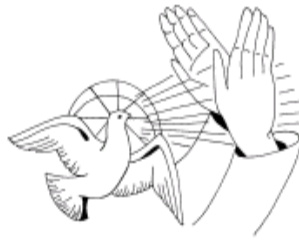

**Reflections on Readings of May 20th
by Deacon Robert Fitzgerald**

The account in Acts today is about Steven who was one of the original seven deacons chosen by the apostles to care for the needs of the poor and vulnerable among them. He was stoned to death for speaking about Jesus in public and Saul, who later became Paul, was the one who oversaw the execution. Steven became the Church's first martyr and as he was dying, like Jesus, he asked forgiveness for those stoning him. These first Christians were so filled by the Holy Spirit that they felt privileged to suffer and die for their faith. Acts goes on to tell the story about the conversion of Paul and how he became the person probably most responsible for spreading the faith around the world. This goes to show us that people can change and that we must give people a chance to respond to God's grace in their lives. We have a tendency in our society to hold a person's faults against them forever. The apostles, even though they were very skeptical, gave Paul the benefit of the doubt and he became one of the greatest preachers and suffered much persecution himself. How many people have we deprived the opportunity to be productive in society because we didn't trust them?

The gospel of John calls us to unity with Jesus and one another. Jesus tells us that this is the only way to become one with the Father. Nobody has seen the Father and we have not even seen the Son, but Jesus says that by loving one another we can encounter both. Jesus tells us that we can find him in all people but especially in the poor.

This month, we as a parish, are trying to identify and reach out to the poor and vulnerable. Our goal is not just to raise money so much as to find Jesus in the poor and give everyone the opportunity to encounter Him and His Father. We must approach the poor as though they were very special and be very careful to respect their dignity no matter what their appearance. The poor consist of many different types of people. The lonely, the unemployed, the depressed, the mentally ill, the homeless and so many others who need our help. We are living the gospel and bringing glory to God whenever we reach out to recipients of the promises of Christ and raise the level of joy in our lives.

Hopefully many are still saving their change for the Haiti houses. We can change the lives of whole families through this effort and can be very proud of the compassion that we are expressing to those who need it most in the world.

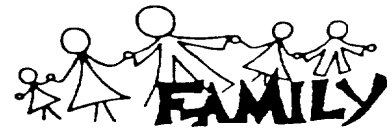

What is Low Vision

People have low vision when they have a permanent loss of some, but not all, of their eyesight. Many people with eye problems do not realize how significant their condition is. Some symptoms of eye problems that cause low vision include:

Blurred vision - particular blurring that doesn't improve with new glasses.

Glare - being troubled by glare or halos in situations where you used to see clearly

Night blindness - not seeing as well in darkness as others do.

Central loss - difficulty seeing things in the center of your eyes, often noticed within reading or trying to recognize faces.

Distortion - straight lines or edges appear curved or bent.

Tunnel vision - difficulty seeing things around the edges of your vision.

If you have any of these symptoms or have any other reason to suspect you have an eye problem, see your eye doctor for a comprehensive eye exam. Even if you have no symptoms, you should visit your eye doctor regularly to help protect your eyesight against unnoticed problems.
