- Develop and implement a program for young adult ministry in the parish. This objective will be referred to the Coordinator of Youth Ministry for implementation.

Goal 5 **To better prepare for the future, strengthen our relationship with the Vicariate.**

Objectives:

- Continue to have three St. Priscilla Parishioners to act as Vicariate Representatives and attend and participate in all meetings.
- Ensure that members of the St. Priscilla Staff, Councils or Commissions actively participate in any efforts to increase collaboration with the other Livonia Parishes and the Vicariate as appropriate. This objective will be referred to Vicariate Representatives to be coordinated through the Parish Staff.
- Invite other parishes in the Vicariate to events held at St. Priscilla as appropriate. This objective will be referred to our Vicariate Representatives for implementation.

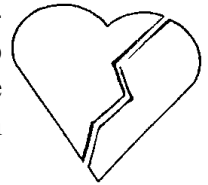

Family Ministry

Married couples struggling with their relationship can find help at the Retrouvaille program offered in July.



Coordinated through the Office for Family Ministry, Retrouvaille (pronounced ret-row-vye) consists of one weekend and follow-up sessions, run by team couples and a priest. Couples relearn communication skills and benefit from presentations and sharing of personal experience by the team couples, which have also experienced marital problems. Mass is offered twice during the weekend, and a priest is present to offer the sacrament of reconciliation.

The Office for Family Ministry, which is part of the Department of Education, supports programs to enrich and nurture marriages in all stages, whether it be through marriage preparation programs and encounters., prayers series or groups for the widowed and divorced.

- Participate in the Young Adult Ministry project in the Vicariate. As this is a new program and little is known regarding implementation, this objective will be referred to Fr. Jim and the Coordinator of Youth Ministry for implementation.

Goal 6 Increase opportunities for adult faith formation.

Objectives:

- Maintain a blended program for religious education including the Growing in Faith Together (G.I.F.T.) program and classroom sessions. This will be referred to the Education Commission for implementation.
- Increase membership of the Education Commission to include a Chairperson and Secretary and a Parish Council Representative. This will be referred to the Education Commission for implementation.
- Develop and organize sub-committees to plan and carryout G.I.F.T. sessions and events. This objective will be referred to the Education Commission for implementation.
- Consider expanding some of the G.I.F.T. sessions to include a question and answer session at a later date for those who still have unanswered questions. Possibly schedule an "Ask the Priest" evening. This objective will be referred to the Education Commission for implementation.
- Promote the RCIA at St. Priscilla Parish. Consider making some of the RCIA sessions open to the parish as a whole. Consider including some evening topic presentations. This objective will be referred to the Education Commission for implementation.
- Consider reorganizing the parish library to make it more organized and accessible to the whole parish. This objective will be referred to the Education Commission for implementation.

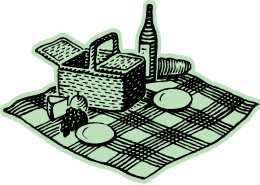

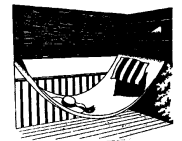

Reflections for July 1st by Deacon Bob Fitzgerald

This week I would like to update everyone on our Haiti House project. This was a truly remarkable experience and I would like to thank all those who participated in it in any way. The staff was overwhelmed by the generosity of the parishioners in their response to this project. When we started out with the concept of possibly donating a house or two to the poor people in the slums of Haiti, we didn't know what to expect. We were told that if we could raise the funds for six houses, we could name a street in the village. This seemed out of reach but a nice idea. We wrapped up the project at the end of May with enough money to supply almost ten homes to families trapped in those terrible conditions. Although we are about seven hundred dollars short of the twenty six thousand dollars needed for ten homes, Food for the Poor is going to try and supplement our donation with anonymous donors at their disposal. This project was undertaken at the same time CSA was in process and our goal in that worthy cause was also met and for that we are extremely grateful.

Jesus promises us that we meet him in the poor and so we are assured that all the generous people who donated to this cause, some of whom donated whole houses, certainly will experience his presence in their lives. These parents who will be given a chance to provide a home for their children will be eternally grateful for your giving spirit. The effect of this good deed will change, not only the lives of these people, but will go on for many generations. Often times that initial opportunity that people receive will completely rejuvenate their lives and they can become productive people who go on to touch the lives of many others.

We will receive periodic updates on the progress of the homes and, upon completion, will receive pictures of the homes and the families who received them. these will be displayed at the main entrance of church in the display cases marked GIFT. Our hope is that this experience will just be a beginning for some to develop a love for the poor and vulnerable of the world. I am sure that it is the best way to become closer to God, who depends on those of us that have been given so much, to reach out to His other children who need our help so badly. Thanks and God bless.

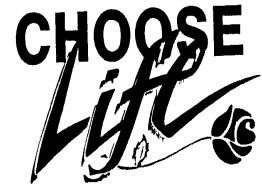

We lift up our hearts, O God, on this day of celebration in gratitude for the gift of being Americans.

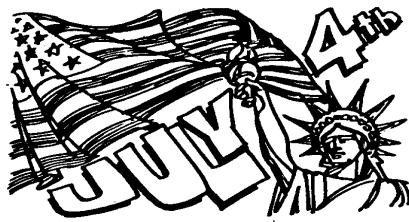
We rejoice with all those who share in the great dream of freedom and dignity for all.
