FR. JIM'S JOURNAL



I am going to be away from the parish this week. During the week I will be beginning the *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds* program offered through the Archdiocese of Detroit. It is a two-year program and will be conducted by the Catholic Leadership Institute at St. John Center in Plymouth. I am one of about 20 priests who will be participating in this group. Using Jesus Christ as the ultimate shepherd and model of leadership, the *Good Leaders, Good Shepherds* curriculum for clergy was specifically designed to help Catholic priests minimize the frustration and energy spent on their administrative roles and to maximize the joy and time spent on the pastoral duties for which they were ordained. Over the next two years, we will be studying the following topics:

- Leadership of Self. We will learn concepts and approaches to manage our own growth and learning in general and in role-specific contexts.
- Leadership in a One-to One context. We will learn concepts and approaches to influence and develop individual staff members and volunteers.
- Leadership of Teams. We will learn approaches for leading in a team context, including phases of team growth and appropriate leadership styles.
- Leadership of Organizations. We will learn to lead in an organizational context, including visioning, planning, and managing change within the parish.
- Leadership of Relationships. We will learn concepts to form strategic alliances within and across parish boundaries to carry out the mission of the Church.

Since I am participating in this training, it will also be available to the parish staff here at St. Priscilla. It is my plan that all of the parish staff will participate in this training in the near future. I will keep you updated as things unfold.

Next weekend, Fr. Adriano Cadei will be coming to our parish

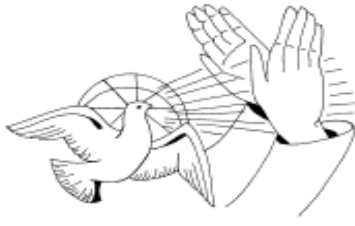

IT'S TIME TO REGISTER YOUR CHILDREN FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CLASSES AND YOUR FAMILY FOR GIFT SESSIONS!

Registration materials will be coming to your home through the mail or can be picked up from the church vestibule or the religious education office.

Classes are offered for students in grades 1—8 on Wednesday and Thursday beginning September 12. Sunday morning classes are offered for children ages 3-4-5 beginning October 7. It is important that you register as soon as possible so we know how many catechists we need and can get student books ordered. Tuition and book fees for this year will remain the same.

CATECHISTS ARE NEEDED

It is time to start thinking about being a catechist for children from Preschool thru eighth grade. Generally classed meet the first two weeks of each month.



There are certain requirements from the archdiocese that must be met before you can volunteer with children. To ensure that you can complete these requirements before classes begin it is important that you volunteer soon. Call or e-mail Joni for more information or to volunteer.

Those who have been catechists in the past should let me know what your intentions are for the 2007/2008 school year. Current catechists get first choice of day and grade before I assign new catechists. Contact me as soon as possible so you can be assured of keeping the class you want.

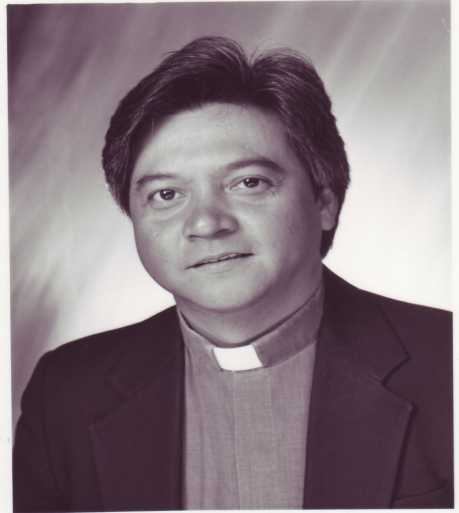

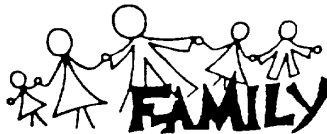

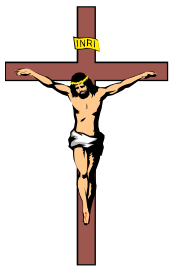

**Reflections on Readings of July 29th
by Deacon Bob Fitzgerald**

All three readings have a theme running through them as to the infinite mercy of God and the need for forgiveness. Probably the biggest obstacle to us loving the way God wants us to, is the inability to forgive and the unwillingness to seek forgiveness. In order to experience the freedom to live happy peaceful lives, we must rid ourselves of all hateful and spiteful feelings toward ourselves and others. We are not free to love when we harbor these feelings.

The first reading from the book of Genesis points out the great mercy of God in that He is willing to forgive the whole sinful town due to the goodness of just ten of it's citizens. This demonstrates the overwhelming power that good has over evil in God's eyes. We too must base our belief in people, not on their sins but rather on the good we can find in them. We, just as God does, should try to forgive those that hurt us even if it does not seem fair. By our forgiving others we are freeing ourselves and them, from being driven by unhealthy feelings that tend to make us less joyful than we should be.

Paul, in his letter to the Colossians, tells us that Jesus freed us from the bondage of sin by nailing it to the cross. Jesus became the sacrificial lamb that paid for the sins of all mankind. This is something too wonderful for us to comprehend because we are not capable of that kind of love. What this means, however, is that we only need to approach God with a sense of contrition in order to have our sins completely forgiven and paid for. If God can be that merciful to us then can we not at least try to forgive those that hurt us.

The Gospel reading reinforces the whole concept of the importance of forgiveness in our lives. When his friends ask Jesus how to pray, he tells them to approach God as they would their own father. This was a very novel concept to a people who more feared God than loved Him. Jesus instructed them to ask for happiness and peace as is found in the kingdom. He encouraged them to request guidance to do His will and take care of their physical needs. He said they should seek forgiveness for their sins. And then he asked them to make a sincere effort to try and forgive those who trespass against them. this was the only thing he asks us to do in that prayer because it is the greatest obstacle to our being able to love.

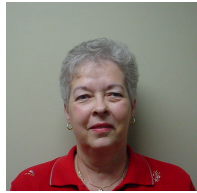

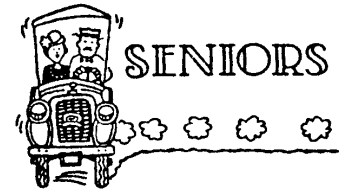
Where Does God Go in the Summer? He goes Wherever You Go!

Summer brings joy and challenges. One challenge is the temptation to neglect our prayer time. There are many ways to pray. Consider some or all of the following:

- ◆ **Plan ahead.** Look at the week ahead. Consider how you might overcome obstacles to prayer. Ask God to show you the way around, over or through the obstacles.
- ◆ **Consider finding and trying new ways to pray.** Pray outside. Pray while actively engaged in activities.
- ◆ **Recommit yourself to your relationship with God.** Choose to spend more time with him, pray and ask God to draw you nearer to him this summer. Recognize that He is with you wherever you go and whatever you do.
- ◆ **Walk with God.** Enjoy a nice walk at the beach, at a park, around the neighborhood. imagine god walking alongside you. Pour out your thoughts, worries, praises and concerns to him as you would to a good friend. Read Matthew 11:28-30 & Luke 24:13-53.
- ◆ **Pray under the stars.** On a clear evening, look up at the stars. Ponder how immense God's plan is and your part in it. Read Genesis 1:14-19, Psalm 8 & Psalm 147:1-5.
- ◆ **Patio prayers.** Enjoy a refreshing glass of tea or lemonade out on the patio or deck while reading your bible. Consider how God refreshes you and strengthens you. Read Genesis 18:1-5 & John 4:40-42.
- ◆ **Gardening with God.** As you work with the soil, work out your problems with God as your counselor. Read Genesis 2:4-15 & Mark 4:26-29.
- ◆ **Vacation prayers.** You can pray in a car full of children, or in the silence of nature's beauty. God watches over you and listens. Read Psalm 139:1-10 & Matthew 14: 13-33.

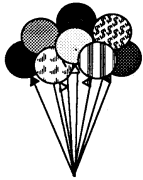

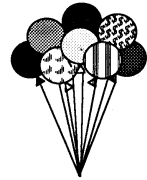


Parish Nurse Ministry
