FR. JIM'S JOURNAL



As I am writing this article today, I learned from Wayne County that they are pouring the cement on Seven Mile Road in front of the church today. It seems that the construction has been going on for so long! Hopefully by the time you read this we will again have easy access to the church property. I want to thank all of you for your patience during this time. Mass attendance is down slightly, but most of you are hanging in with me. Thank you so much for your loyalty!

As we have the construction on Seven Mile Road, we are also having some construction on the inside of the church. We now have some new walls and doors so that we can lock off the church from the rest of the building, making our church more secure. We have also enlarged the Reconciliation Room so that it will be a little more comfortable and welcoming. Within the next couple of weeks we will be having the church painted. This will require that we remove everything from the walls. The Worship Commission is working on a plan for moving around some of the artwork. When everything is re-hung, we want to make sure everything ends up where it is going to stay. I am confident of your continued patience as we complete out internal construction.

The Stewardship Commission has been working toward getting a new church sign to replace the old one that was located on Seven Mile Road along the driveway. We are currently working on the design. We want a permanent looking sign with changeable lettering that is lit, with some brick or stonework. We want to make sure that the location of the church buildings is more accessible and welcoming to the community

We have completed our Financial Report for the fiscal year. The Total Operating Income for the year in the budget was \$476,290. The actual income for the year was \$561,460. Our income exceeded what we needed to meet the budget. Our Total Operating Expenditures in the budget was \$452,240. Our actual expenses were \$439,950. Our actual expenses were less than what was projected in the budget. The financial state of St. Priscilla Parish is sound. Thank you for being such good stewards!

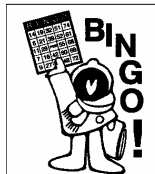

Entire villages accepted the apostolic church....the KGB would try to follow us but we were able to keep out of their view in a way that was nearly miraculous."

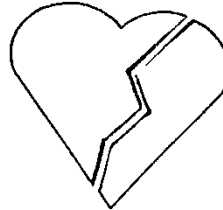

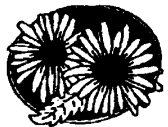

Pope Benedict XVI, "Don't Work too Hard"

Working too hard, even for those leading the Catholic church, is bad for the spirit, Pope Benedict XVI said Sunday as he greeted tourists at his summer residence in Rome.

During his traditional weekly appearance to bless the faithful, Benedict quoted from writings of St. Bernard in the 12th century meant for the popes of his time on the subject of overwork.

Benedict quoted the saint as advising pontiffs to "watch out for the dangers of an excessive activity, whatever...the job that you hold, because many jobs often lead to the 'hardening of the heart', as well as 'suffering of the spirit, loss of intelligence.'"

"That warning is valid for every kind of work, even those involved in the governing of the church," 79 year-old Benedict said. Having had a vacation in the Italian Alps in July, Benedict is spending what remains of August and much of September, in the papal palace in Castle Gandolfo, a lakeside town in the Alban Hills southeast of Rome.

The pontiff will interrupt his holidays to make a day trip on Sept. 1 to a religious sanctuary and fly to his homeland, Germany, for a pilgrimage Sept. 9-14.



A 92-year-old, petite, well-poised and proud man, who is fully dressed each morning by 8:00 AM, with his hair fashionably coifed and shaved perfectly, even though he is legally blind, moved to a nursing home today. His wife of 70 years recently passed away, making the move necessary. After many hours of waiting patiently in the lobby of the nursing home, he smiled sweetly when told his room was ready.

As he maneuvered his walker to the elevator, I provided a visual description of his tiny room, including the eyelet sheets that had been hung on his window.

"I love it," he stated with the enthusiasm of an eight-year-old having just been presented with a new puppy.

"Mr. Jones, you haven't seen the room; just wait."

"That doesn't have anything to do with it," he replied.

"Happiness is something you decide on ahead of time. Whether I like my room or not doesn't depend on how the furniture is arranged...it's how I arrange my mind. I already decided to love it. It's a decision I make every morning when I wake up. I HAVE A CHOICE, I can spend the day in bed, recounting the difficulties I have with the parts of my body that no longer work, or get out of bed and be thankful for the parts that do work".

"Each day is a gift, and as long as my mind still works, my eyes will still see, and I'll focus on the new day and all the happy memories I've stored away".

Old age is like a bank account. You withdraw from what you've put in! So, my advice to you is to deposit a lot of happiness into your bank account of memories. I would like to thank you for your part in filling my memory bank. And, I'd like you to know that I'm still making deposits.

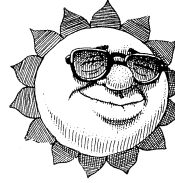

Sun Safety

Did you know?

- A. 1 in 5 Americans will develop skin cancer in the course of a lifetime.
 - B. Skin cancer is the most common of all cancers.
 - C. More than 90% of skin cancers are caused by sun exposure.
 - D. Protect yourself and your family all year round.
 - ◆ Seek the shade, especially between 10am-4pm
 - ◆ Do not burn.
 - ◆ Avoid tanning and UV tanning booths.
 - ◆ Use a sunscreen with an SPF of 15 or higher every day.
 - Apply 1 ounce (2 tablespoons) of sunscreen to ALL EXPOSED AREAS 30 minutes before going outside. Reapply every two hours or after swimming or excessive sweating.
1. Cover up with clothing, including a broad-brimmed hat and UV-blocking sunglasses.
 2. Keep newborns out of the sun.
 3. See your doctor every year for a professional skin exam
 4. Examine your own skin head-to-toe every month.



The ABCDE's of Moles and Melanoma

What To Look For:

Moles, brown spots and growths are usually harmless—usually but not always. Anyone who has more than 100 moles is at greater risk for melanoma (the most dangerous form of skin cancer). The first signs can appear in one or more moles. That's why it's so important to get to know your skin very well. Examine the skin all over your body once a month and have a physician check you over once a year. Look for:

- A. **Asymmetry**—If you draw a line through a mole, the two halves will not match, meaning it is asymmetrical, a warning sign for melanoma.
- B. **Border**—The borders of an early melanoma tend to be uneven. The edges may be scalloped or notched.
- C. **Color**—Having a variety of colors is another warning signal. A number of different shades of brown, tan or black could appear. A melanoma may also become red, white or blue.
- D. **Diameter**—Melanomas usually are larger in diameter than the size of the eraser on your pencil (1/4 inch), but they may sometimes be smaller when first detected.
- E. **Evolving**—When a mole is evolving, see a doctor. Any change—in size, shape, color, elevation, or any new symptom such as bleeding, itching or crusting, points to danger.

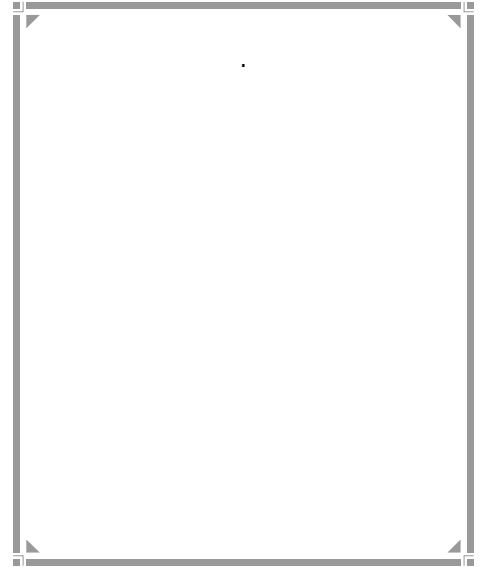
